Clergy Pages

Dear Friends

As the last Focus was a double issue, for December 2023 and January 2024, covering Advent, Christmas, New Year and Epiphany, this one takes us straight into a very significant month.

I am writing this to you at the beginning of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Our identity as South Huddersfield Churches Together gives us plenty of opportunity to work and worship together, and to serve the local community through the Together Shop, pop-up shops, Warm Welcome and The Bread and Butter Thing. The centrepiece of our Unity Week is 2 days away at time of writing - the Covenant Service which Tim Francis will have led for us all at Netherton Methodist Church - and those of you who shared in that mighty service will have had the chance to renew your covenant with God in Wesley's memorable words, using either this traditional prayer or more contemporary words:

I am no longer my own but yours.

Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will;
put me to doing, put me to suffering;
let me be employed for you or laid aside for you,
exalted for you or brought low for you;
let me be full, let me be empty,
let me have all things, let me have nothing:
I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things
to your pleasure and disposal.
And now, glorious and blessed God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
you are mine and I am yours. So be it.
And the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven.

FOCUS

These Methodist words became included in Anglican liturgy in 2006, when the Covenant Service became the New Year part of a book of services called "Times and Seasons". So, it now belongs to all of us. I think it's timely as this is a year in which God will make demands of us and we will need to lean on God to supply us with all things, including faith hope and love. We have said our goodbyes to Julie as parish priest - but she remains our Area Dean while we work our way through a time of vacancy. The community of Holy Trinity South Crosland are preparing to close the church building - but you/we remain the body of Christ and need to listen carefully to God and one another to take the next steps together in accordance with God's will. Lent can help - traditionally the springtime of the church year and a chance to grow in faith and the great spiritual disciplines of prayer and bible reading, both of which undergird good decision-making. Lent starts on February 14th., and there will be 2 celebrations of Holy Communion on Ash Wednesday, including receiving a cross of ash on your forehead. 10am at South Crosland and 6.30pm at Armitage Bridge. We will not be running Lent Groups this year but there will be daily worship in Holy Week.

And we all will be watching out for one another this year, right across our 4 congregations, Netherton Methodist, Holy Trinity South Crosland, St Paul's Armitage Bridge and Berry Brow Newsome. Peace and all good

Sheep Drive

In 1977 I was granted the Freedom of the City of London; because I had gained the Fellowship of the Worshipful Company of Spectacle Makers by examination in 1976.In 1997 I was clothed in the Livery of the Spectacle Makers. The Spectacle Makers is one of 110 livery companies; the livery companies provide the City of London with its 25 Aldermen. They also nominate one of these Aldermen to be their presiding officer who is the Lord Mayor of the City of London.

The benefits of having the Freedom of the City are the right to drive sheep and cattle across the Thames via London Bridge toll free, to carry a naked sword in public and if you are found drunk and incapable by the City of London Police, they will bundle you in a taxi to take you home.

The first of these has been on my bucket list for some time and last year I finally drove sheep over the Thames but via Southwark Bridge. (London Bridge is closed). I donated to the Wool Company, and they arranged for the sheep to be available on a sunny day in September.

A group of Spectacle Makers and their guests gathered at the appointed time; we were given stickers confirming which group we were in for our sheep drive. We walked across the bridge to our given start point and at the appointed time drove our group of sheep along the bridge.

Sheep drive concluded, we adjourned to the north side of the river where we were each given a certificate as a memento of the day.

Knit along this Lent

Victoria Methodist Church in Bristol is excited to be hosting another mystery knitalong this Lent!

This year we will be knitting a prayer shawl (or blanket) over the course of Lent: the exact design of the shawl is a mystery and will be revealed as knitters progress through the project!

We will cast on together on Ash Wednesday (14th February) and knitters will have their shawl finished in time for Easter day on the 31st March.

Knitters will receive daily knitting instructions by email each week; these will be accompanied by daily reflections/meditations which have kindly been written by eight different Ministers and worship leaders from the Bristol circuit and beyond.

The Welcome letter, which includes general information (such as yarn/needles needed etc) and the pattern for a practice swatch will be sent out this Friday 19th January, and the weekly emails will go out from the beginning of Lent.

The pattern has been designed to be accessible to knitters of all abilities: if you can cast on and off, and can work the basic knit and purl stitches you should be able to join in!
