Prayer for the Day

Prayers for the Week

Monday 1st 'St David's Day' Psalm 26, Jeremiah 7.21-end, John 6.41-51

Tuesday 2nd Psalm 50, Jeremiah 8.1-15, John 6.52-59

Wednesday 3rd Psalm 35, Jeremiah 8.18-9.11, John 6.60-end

Friday 5th Psalm 40, Jeremiah 10.1-16, John 7.14-24

Father, it is your grace that transforms our lives. It is your power that renews our worship. It is your love that gives us hope,

Saturday 6th Psalm 3, Jeremiah 10.17-24, John 7.25-36

God of hope, we thank you that, in Jesus, we hear your word of grace. That, in him, you have promised to hold our hand and to show us the way. It is through the Holy Spirit that your hope is planted in our hearts and lives.

Saturday 13th Psalm 31, Jeremiah 16.10-17.4, John 9.1-17

Prayers for the Week

Monday 22nd Psalm 73, Jeremiah 21.1-10, John 11.28-44

Lord, you have called us to serve you and we have tried, but we have become disillusioned with ourselves, with others, and with your way of love, so that now we try to ignore your promptings to show love, to offer care.

Tuesday 23rd Psalm 35, Jeremiah 22.1-5, 13-19, John 11.45-end

Lord, sometimes we have neglected and angered those who love us by spending too much time loving others; sometimes we have become over-tired and stressed attempting to do more than we can do.

Wednesday 24th Psalm 55, Jeremiah 22.20-23.8, John 12.1-11

Lord, things don't always work out as we would wish them to; our loving words and actions are misconstrued or treated with suspicion.

Thursday 25th 'The Annunciation' Psalm 111, 1 Samuel 2.1-10, Romans 5.12-21

Lord, we lose our patience with those we are trying to help, or with who we work with, and we feel that we are letting you down.

Friday 26th Psalm 22, Jeremiah 24, John 12.20-36a

Lord, we get frustrated with the system and feel that love has little power to really put things right, forgive us, love us.

Saturday 27th Psalm 23, Jeremiah 25.1-14, John 12.36b-end

Lord, we know that our way of seeing things is not yours. Remind us again that you have not called us to an easy way of life, but to tread the path of suffering love, the path to salvation.

Sunday 28th March – Palm Sunday – Psalm 118: 1-2& 19-end & Mark 1: 1-11

Prayer for the Day

True and humble king, hailed by the crowd as Messiah: grant us the faith to know you and love you that we may be found beside you on the way of the cross, which is the path of glory.

Prayers for the Week

Monday 29th Psalm 41, Lamentations 1.1-12a, Luke 22.1-23

Blessed are you, Lord Jesus, for you are our Saviour. As you were welcomed into Jerusalem, may we welcome you into our homes and our lives?

Tuesday 30th Psalm 27, Lamentations 3.1-18, Luke 22.24-53 (or 39-53)

Almighty and all-seeing God, we thank you for this season of Lent; a time to reflect upon our discipleship, to consider our calling, to examine ourselves and to assess the health of our faith.

Wednesday 31st Psalm 102, Jeremiah 11.18-20, Luke 22.54-71

Heavenly Father, help us, prayerfully and humbly, to examine ourselves and honestly acknowledge our faults, not so that we might wallow in self-pity, but so that we may receive cleansing, healing and forgiveness.

Thursday 1st 'Maundy Thursday' Psalm 42, Leviticus 16.2-24, Luke 23.1-25

Lord, we commit ourselves to serve you by serving one another, we commit ourselves to love you by loving one another. We commit ourselves to bring you glory and to honour your holy name through the lives we live and through our words of witness to your love.

Friday 2nd 'Good Friday' Psalm 69, Genesis 22.1-18,

On this Good Friday Father, we thank you for Jesus' death on the cross of Calvary and that through him we can know our sins are forgiven and to be assured that we are accepted. Father again and again you astound us with your love that overwhelms our sin and our self-centredness. In Jesus you have wiped the slate clean, you have given us a new page in the book of our lives and have given us the opportunity to begin again.

Saturday 3rd 'Easter Eve' Psalm 142, Hosea 6.1-6, John 2.18-22

In the silence of the grave, Lord Jesus, you restore our life, in the darkness of death, you bring life to our grief. In the destruction of your body Lord Jesus, you heal our brokenness. In the dawning of the new day, you shake the earth with a power no tomb can hold. May we Lord Jesus live in anticipation of your glory and rejoice in your hope.
